The driveway and streets that surround Lyndhurst are busy places. In addition to the drop-off and pick-up of students, we also have staff arriving to/leaving from work, school visitors parking in the back of the school, and deliveries of supplies. In order to keep everyone safe at Lyndhurst, we would like students in Divisions 3, 4, and 5 and their parents/guardians to wait "on the grass" or "behind the line" or "on the sidewalk" before they enter the school in the morning and when they leave at the end of the day. We hope that this small adjustment to our usual routines will keep everyone safe.

RECYCLING & COMPOSTING PILOT PROGRAM

Our recycling bins have arrived! Just before Spring Break, Lyndhurst's pilot program for recycling and composting will begin. Bins will be placed in 5 places around the school (outside the PAC kitchen, in the primary classroom area, in the intermediate classroom area, in the staffroom, and near the daycare downstairs). Black garbage cans will be removed from all classrooms. Composting buckets/bins will be placed in classrooms. Mr. Singh's leadership students, Mr. Singh, and Ms. Herdman will help everyone with this transition. Thank you for your patience as this program gets started and we work out the new processes and procedures.

School Hours & Supervision

The office and school are open from 8:30am – 3:10pm from Monday to Friday with a few exceptions (e.g., Professional Development Days, statutory holidays, etc.)

Just a reminder to families – there is no supervision for students before 8:50am and after 3:00pm unless students are in school programs (e.g., clubs, sports, etc.)

Recess and Lunch Hour

All students will be enjoying the outdoors for 15 minutes at recess and approximately 40 minutes during the lunch hour. Our outdoor time is called a "West Coast Recess and Lunch". Please ensure that your child is prepared with appropriate clothing for the weather outside throughout the school year.

***It is highly recommended that all students (Kindergarten to Grade 7) also keep a change of clothes (or two changes of clothes) at school in case it is needed.

Scent Aware School

COMMUNITY INFORMATION

Student Learning Survey 2024/2025

The Provincial Student Learning Survey is unique in its scope, size and usefulness to schools. It gathers information from parents/guardians/caregivers, teachers, and students on topics related to school environment, safety, and achievement. The information is used for planning in individual schools and provides a district and provincial perspective.

This Spring, the Student Learning Survey will be administered at school to students in grades 4 and 7. We encourage parents/guardians/caregivers to participate in this survey as well, as the results are important in identifying and celebrating current strengths, as well as determining where the school needs to focus improvement. The surveys contain standard questions for the Province – in addition, questions from the school and/or district that focus on local conditions or issues may be included.

The survey can be completed electronically and can be accessed on the Internet at https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/education-training/k-12/support/student-learning-survey. Any computer or mobile device with an Internet connection can be used, and access to the e-survey is simple and secure. The survey can be accessed through the link and by clicking on Take the Survey. On the login page, click on the Parents icon, and then select the school district and school name where your child attends school. Provincial, District and School Reports for previous years can be viewed at the same site under the *Results* section.

The e-survey site will be open until May 2, 2025.
